

General Meeting 7 January 2016

Officer Dace spoke. A new class of cadets has graduated and will begin working with experienced officers.

John Andrews, who attended the December 10th workshop, spoke about the Cruise Ship Terminal. There is no need for a zoning change. The largest ships will carry 4,500 passengers but most will be limited to 3,500. Chartres and Poland will be the main routes for taxis and cars. Parking will be \$16.00 per day. Sewage is dumped at sea. Garbage is unknown.

It is unknown what uses will be put into the building when it is not in use as a cruise ship terminal. If federal funds are to be used a mitigation process is required.

Andrew Freeman spoke on behalf of the proposed combination hotel, hostel, bar and restaurant on a vacant lot in Bywater. The project is 48,000 sq ft which will require a conditional use from the city. The legal limit for such a business is 10,000 sq ft. He was informed by those attending the meeting that they had many concerns about noise and traffic interrupting the lives of permanent residents. He stated that their project is modeled on something similar in Miami.
